MINUTES OF MONTHLY COUNCIL MEETING
May 14, 2008, at 2:00 P.M.
WOODLAND SCHOOL AUDITORIUM

A regular monthly Council Meeting of the Borough of Barrington was held on May 14, 2008, at 2:00 p.m. at Woodland School Auditorium. Mayor Rink announced that as this was Youth Government Day in Barrington, he welcomed the following kids who are on the dais with Mayor and Council: Ashley Pico as Mayor, Tom Gormley with Council President Klaus, Drew Mogck with Councilman Dinella, Chris Raiczyk with Councilman Vincent, Hunter Beebe with Solicitor Timothy Higgins, Julia Porado as Clerk with Terry Shannon, Austin Brooks with Councilwoman Bergeron and Nikki Peletsky with Councilman Cowling.
