

**RESOLUTION NO. 7-2011-69  
DESIGNATING RECIPIENTS FOR THE CAMDEN COUNTY HOUSING REHABILITATION  
PROGRAM AND AUTHORIZING CAMDEN COUNTY DIVISION OF COMMUNITY  
DEVELOPMENT AS ADMINISTRATIVE AGENT**

**WHEREAS**, the Barrington Housing Rehabilitation Agency, hereinafter referred to as "Agency" has received and reviewed applications by certain homeowners specified herein for rehabilitation of their dwellings under the Camden County Community Development Block Grant Program; and

**WHEREAS**, said agency has determined that said homeowners are eligible under the guidelines of said program; and

**WHEREAS**, the County of Camden has been authorized by Cooperation Agreements between the County and the various participating municipalities to administer the Housing Rehabilitation Program from funds received under the Community Development Block Grant Program;

  - a. Execute any and all documents and perform all administrative functions which may be required or desired in order to carry out the terms and conditions of the Community Development Block Grant Program.
  - b. Make payments to the homeowners and contractors in amounts determined by the County for services performed in rehabilitating the dwellings specified herein.
